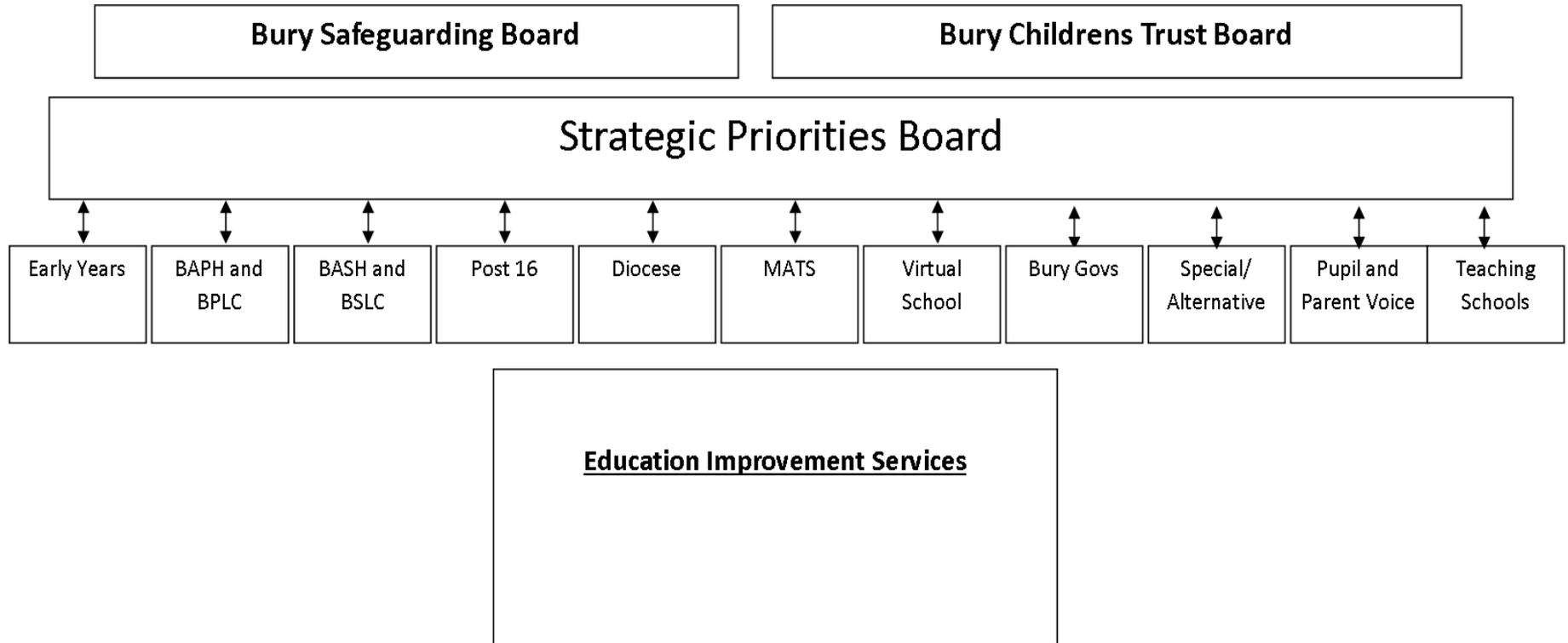

Since 2011 Bury, in response to the Government's policy, has been implementing strategies that give schools greater autonomy.

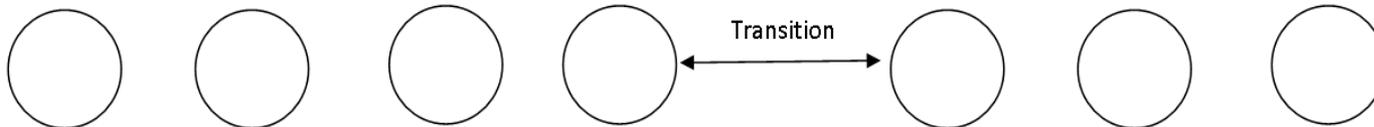
To provide further autonomy and meet the needs of schools in a system led model the following education system has been devised...

# The Role of the Cluster (1)

**Support the self-improvement of the whole Cluster so that all children achieve the best by:**

- a) establishing, maintaining and regularly reviewing, the remit, terms of reference and codes of conduct for the Cluster.
- b) promoting the work of the Cluster, encouraging attendance and participation by all Cluster schools.
- c) ensuring concise and efficient reporting to the Cluster, the Education Improvement Board and Governing Bodies on progress made by individual schools and by the schools in the Cluster.
- d) agreeing to the sharing of non-statutory school performance data, in line with the Data Sharing Protocol, in order to identify schools' good practice and those at risk of becoming vulnerable.
- e) evaluating and reporting, collectively, on the strengths and weaknesses of all schools within the Cluster, based on the information provided by the Education Improvement Board, with confidence, rigour and sensitivity so that schools in need are identified, prioritised, their areas for development verified and are in a position to obtain the additional support necessary for them to make improvements.
- f) identifying examples of good practice across the Cluster (provided by schools within/outside the Cluster, Teaching schools, National College, commercial companies) and enabling the dissemination of good practice to all schools in the Borough.
- g) providing feedback on the quality of the support from the Education Improvement Board and on the effectiveness of the Bury Strategic Education Board's Strategy.

# The Role of the Cluster (2)

- 2. Work together to pool Cluster resources and share expertise in order to improve the practice of all schools within the Cluster by:**
- a) using the pooled Cluster resources to improve the practice of all schools giving highest priority to those schools deemed vulnerable.
  - b) ensuring allocated funds are processed according to need in agreement with all schools in the Cluster.
  - c) defining the methods of calculating and supplying the support.

# The Role of the Cluster (3)

**3. Work collaboratively to prevent schools in the Cluster from falling below floor standards or being graded as inadequate by Ofsted by:**

- a) working together to produce a Local Authority categorisation model that identifies schools who are vulnerable or at risk of becoming vulnerable or underperforming.
- b) working collectively to apply the categorisation process effectively so that vulnerable schools or those in danger of becoming vulnerable are identified and supported.
- c) producing a plan for each vulnerable school that provides targeted support to address the areas for improvement, sustainably.

# The Role of the Cluster (4)

## 3. Continued...

d) determining the capacity to respond to supporting schools in need based on capacity within the Cluster or, if necessary, utilising the funding available to procure the support from other sources.

e) ensuring support for vulnerable schools is implemented effectively.

f) procuring a verification (diagnostic) exercise where there is lack of clarity in the causes of underperformance in a school either from within the Cluster or from other sources.

g) monitoring the impact of the support for each vulnerable school on a termly basis and reporting back to the Education Improvement Board.

# The Role of the Cluster (5)

**4. Focus primarily on improving standards of teaching and learning and leadership and management by:**

a) identifying and sharing good practice based on the needs of individual schools or on cross-Cluster needs as identified through the categorisation process and collective feedback.

b) Arrange and evaluate collective CPD arrangements to raise standards of teaching and learning and leadership and management, and feed back to the School Improvement Board on quality in order to inform all schools.

# Cluster Leadership

Also at each Cluster Meeting the thinking behind how these clusters will be led was also discussed:

- It is proposed that each cluster will have a Lead or Leads.
- It is also proposed that these will be supported by a Vice Lead, or Vice Leads.
- The selection of individuals for these roles will be subject to eligibility criteria that are currently under discussion.
